


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Pathway to becoming a Registered Nurse or Midwife

Assistant in Nursing

Support Registered Nurses and Midwives to deliver safe, person-centred care, working under direct supervision.

Student in Nursing

Undergraduate nursing or midwifery students work under the indirect supervision of a registered nurse or midwife in clinical setting.

Cadetship

Nursing or Midwifery Cadets complete a 12-month program with 60 days of paid part-time work experience in medical or surgical wards, building clinical skills and knowledge while studying. Duties performed under indirect RN/RM supervision.

Enrolled Nurse

Enrolled Nurses work under direct or in direct supervision of a Registered Nurse or Midwife. Enrolled Nurses work in a wide variety of settings including acute and subacute, primary health care and residential settings.

Enrolled Nurses with Advanced Skills (ENAS)

ENAS support RNs/RMs to deliver patient-centred care, undertaking a range of authorised clinical tasks and responsibilities within their scope, under direct and indirect supervision.

Registered Nurse

Registered Nurses work autonomously and collaboratively to provide patient-centred care across the lifespan, supporting health promotion, prevention, treatment, and holistic wellbeing.

Midwife (M)

Midwives provide woman-centred care throughout pregnancy, labour, birth, and the postpartum period, supporting healthy pregnancy and birth outcomes.
